Copy what your child does

If your child bangs two bricks together, you do the same.

If she feeds dolly with a spoon, you copy.



See if she will then copy you putting the spoon in the cup.

Copying sounds and faces

Make funny faces in the mirror. See if your child can copy you.



You copy any faces they makes.

Copy any sounds that your child makes.

Make easy sounds for your child to copy - (eg aaahh, bababa etc)

Balls or bean bags

Copy what your child does when playing and see if he can copy you.

E.g. roll the ball, throw the ball Make teddy kick the ball, Put the bean bag on your head.
