At Ravenbank Primary School, we believe that PE and Sport plays an important role in fulfilling our vision statement: Working Together to Achieve Success. We welcomed the Government's announcement in March 2023 confirming that the government were committing over £600 million across the next two academic years (2023-24 & 2024-25) for the continuation of the Primary PE and Sport Premium — a funding commitment to improve the quality of PE and sports in primary schools to help children benefit from regular activity. The funding will continue to prioritise children's physical wellbeing, help children get an active start in life and support primary schools to improve the quality of their PE and sport provision.

At Ravenbank we believe that this funding has a positive outcome on our children and has enabled us to aspire to greater heights. PE and school sports are vital in enhancing the physical, social and emotional well-being of our young people. PE and school sport is highly valued at Ravenbank Primary School. For the academic year of 2021-2022 and 2022 – 2023 we were again awarded the School Games 'Platinum' award, previously awarded in 2019. This is a fantastic recognition for the hard work the children and staff have done in all areas of the PE curriculum and when planning and taking part in school competitions. Additionally, we have excelled across a range of out of school sports competitions at local, district and county level.
