Apologies for the delay in uploading our new school meals menu. This will be available soon on our website under parents/school meals.

KS2 WALKING HOME

Once children start Year 3 they are allowed to leave the classroom without waiting for an adult to collect them. If you still wish your child to wait in to the classroom please speak with your child's class teacher.

SMARTPHONES AND WATCHES

Polite reminder children must keep their smartphones and watches in their bags at all times. If they are taken out during lesson time the teacher will keep them safe until the end of the school day. This can be very distracting for everyone during valuable lesson time. If you need to get an urgent message to your child during the school day, please do so via the school office. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter

Here are a few reminders for the new term

- Registration starts at 8:40am and ends at 8:55am, children arriving after this time will be marked as late.
- KS1 home time is 3:10pm, KS2 home time is 3:15pm.
- ParentPay needs to be kept in credit at all times. If your account is in arrears you will receive a text from school to top it up.
- We are a healthy, <u>nut free school</u> and we do not allow crisps, cakes, biscuits or sweets for snacks. Please send in a nut free healthy alternative.
- Please also ensure that packed lunches are nut free as we have a number of children who have severe nut allergies.
- When it is your child's birthday they can come to school in non-uniform. Please do not send in any sweet treats to share. If you wish to buy something for the class we suggest a toy or game that they can all use during wet play.
- Parents dropping off by car; please help school to be a good neighbour by not blocking driveways and parking safely.
- Attendance is closely monitored (please see below). If your child's attendance has dropped below 95% you will receive correspondence from school alerting you. It is mandatory that school follows strict Government guidelines and although we are mindful that illness and some circumstances can't be avoided, we still have to report attendance figures to all parent/carers. Please click on the following link which will take you to the NHS website to help you when deciding whether or not to keep your child off school https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/. Please note if children are off school due to vomiting or diarrhoea they are unable to return to school for 48 hours following the last bout.
- All medication must come through the school office so that the correct medication forms can be completed. If the medication has not been prescribed we may be able to accept it if deemed an exceptional circumstance.
- Please label everything so it can be returned to your child. Any unnamed clothing will go to our pre-loved sale rail.

Attendance Matters

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE



Attendance in Warrington schools is monitored very closely and any pupils with less than 95% may be challenged as regular school attendance is crucial if pupils are to achieve positive outcomes. The Government outlines that any pupil with an attendance level of under 90% will be classed as a 'persistent absentee'. This means that any pupil whose Every Day Counts.... attendance drops below 90%, their attendance will be discussed and scrutinised on a regular basis. School attendance is

essential as research has found poor school attendance does have a detrimental effect on a child's academic progress.

The second most common reason for absence from school is a family holiday. Whilst the pandemic has meant that many families have been unable to go on holiday over the last 2 years we must stress that any holiday planned in term time will not be authorised. Children and families

have 175 days off school to spend time together, including weekends and school holidays. Schools rightly have to prioritise attendance during term time.

Please note under section 7 of the Education Act 1996 parents are responsible for making sure that their children of compulsory school age receive a suitable full-time education. If a child of compulsory school age fails to attend regularly at school, the parents may be guilty of an offence and can be prosecuted by the local authority.

Stage 1 90%-95% Attendance is a cause for concern. If appropriate, a letter will be issued or the class teacher will discuss this with you. You will have the opportunity to meet with the Attendance Co-ordinator to discuss if the school can assist

Stage 2 90% and below

Attendance now falls into the category of persistent absentee. The Local Authority monitor attendance and if there is no improvement, we will have no alternative but to produce a case file.
