


schoolcloud The booking system for the learning reviews will go live Monday 23rd October at 7am and will close on Monday 6th November at noon. Information on how to book an

We are delighted to announce that after our formal 'Outdoor Play and Learning' (OPAL) assessment we have been awarded the **OPAL Platinum Award**. Our scores achieved in this assessment comfortably put us into the 'Platinum' category and actually puts us in the top 1% of schools in the UK. We are extremely proud of all the children, staff and governors for all their hard work in ensuring our children have outstanding opportunities for play and learning in the outdoors.

OPAL Mentor, Mike Barclay said, "If anyone wonders 'why do OPAL', they should visit Ravenbank. In one single lunchtime there is so much to see. Children of all ages move freely across the site. They know where they are allowed to go (pretty much anywhere) and what they are allowed to do (most things) and they pretty much get on with it for themselves. There's a really big range of opportunities to play. From small world resources, to staged performance space, trim trail and tyre park, scooter zone, space for footy, developed woodlands, trees to climb, bushes to hide in, music, dressing up, loads of junk materials, den building, sand pit, mud kitchen, muddy puddles and so on. This is a place where every child seems to be busy playing in whatever they would like to play on that particular day. The staff on hand appear relaxed and happy, getting involved as and when required but also just allowing children to play without unnecessary adult intervention. This is a place where a group of young girls

can run to the loose parts shed and pull a blanket out for sitting on while they eat their packed lunches outside. Meanwhile a group of KS1 boys are busy building a make shift slide from four planks of wood lent up against a box, with a baking tray to sit on. Children appear on the field already in their wellies and disappear off into the woods, where they can be found marching around with big sticks, creeping between bushes, climbing trees and playing in imaginary worlds. At the front of the school children can be seen happily playing on their own in the sandpit or digging a bit of earth up with a spoon to add to a muddy concoction. This is what we mean by developing a culture of play and behind the scenes Ravenbank has invested serious time and effort into making this possible. It has been quite a journey and has involved a real shift in thinking, particularly when it comes to risk management. Staff on the working group have worked really hard to develop a robust policy framework, communicate the benefits of this approach to all stakeholders (particularly parents), open up and develop the school grounds, provide children with access to things like wellies and junk resources, and elevate the role of supervising staff. And importantly it has paid off, the school is experiencing the direct benefits of improved play time provision. There is a real sense that this way of working has become embedded into the school's practice, which gives confidence that the



school will be able to maintain this approach long term. A huge well done to all involved. "


