Thank you for your school's recent donation to Warrington Foodbank. Did you know that Ravenbank Primary School's collection amounted to 153.15kg? This means the generosity of your school community has helped 10 people to be fed for 3 days, which equates to a value of approximately £383. We really rely on harvest donations at this time of year to help replenish our stocks. As you are no doubt aware, from stories in the News, demand for the Foodbank is high and still rising due to economic pressures and rising bills. As a result of these financial pressures our donations are also down, so we are struggling to keep

our stocks at a level to meet the rising need in our local community. Therefore your support is more important to us now than ever.

We also understand that Cerys in Year 4 has also been busy baking and selling cakes to raise funds for the Foodbank, so a double thank you to your school community.

Here are a few statistics which you may find interesting and wish to share with your school community alongside the success of your collection.

- 17,000 people received emergency food from our Foodbank last year
- Between January and July 2023 Warrington Foodbank fed an average of 1900 people per month
- One third of the 1900 people were children
- We have experienced a 45% increase in Foodbank use compared to the same time last year

Some other points that your community may find surprising or interesting are:

- The Foodbank is not only helping the homeless and unemployed but also people who are in **paid employment** as their wages are not enough to cover the cost of bills and food
- During the last 6 months we have had to spend almost 4 times as much of our limited cash donations on food than we did last year
- Our stock levels are reaching crisis point

Key facts about how your local Foodbank operates:

- We provide 3 days of emergency food to local individuals and families in crisis
- These people are referred to the Foodbank by frontline care professionals such as social workers, GPs, welfare advisers, Headteachers, housing organisations, probation officers and the citizens advice bureau
- Our team of volunteers welcome guests to the Foodbank and offer them a hot drink. We also listen to their situation and signpost them to other agencies who can help them

Well done to all Ravenbank pupils who attended.


Celebrating Sporting Success

What do I need?

Equipment & Protection We have a supply of hockey sticks for players to borrow if they don't have their own stick. It is the club policy that all players are required to wear shin pads and mouth guards in all training sessions and games. Junior players who wear glasses must wear sports goggles or contact lenses in all training and games. We encourage children to wear protective gloves a a minimum on their left hand (preferably on both hands).
