We are aware that school has other methods of communication i.e. DoJo but would like to clarify the correct methods of contacting school. Teachers are unable to check and respond to any messages you send through DoJo during the school day so please send them to the school email address. Absences can be logged via School Spider or by leaving a telephone message.

Attendance Matters



Attendance is closely monitored. If your child's attendance has dropped below 90% you will receive correspondence from school alerting you. It is mandatory that school follows strict Government guidelines and although we are mindful that illness and some circumstances can't be avoided, we still have to report attendance figures to all parent/carers.



All medication must come through the school office so that the correct medication forms can be completed. We are unable to accept medication that has not been prescribed unless in exceptional circumstances.



As the school grounds are very muddy at the moment, wellies are the preferred footwear option for lunchtimes. Also, if your child has waterproof trousers or a spare pair of joggers, please bring these in, as the children are likely to get muddy.
