USEFUL REMINDERS/INFORMATION



PUPIL PREMIUM FREE SCHOOL MEALS

A reminder that anyone who is currently entitled or becomes entitled to Free School Meals up until 31st March 2025 will still remain protected until the end of their phase of education (end of Primary School or end of Secondary). Each eligible child at Ravenbank receives a £70 contribution from the school for extra-curricular enrichment.

To ensure Ravenbank receives the maximum amount of pupil premium funding we would like to ensure that families eligible apply before 31st March 2025- even if you think you are not eligible as your circumstances may change at a later date. PHOTOGRAPH PERMISSIONS

I wanted to update you in our progress with photograph permissions. You will be aware that we've been seeking updated permissions for using your child's image on 'social media'. I wanted to clarify the situation. The school has decided not to use any children's images on X (formerly Twitter) due to ethical concerns about the platform. We will retain our account, but only to share photographs of children's work and curriculum updates.

If you have given us consent, this means we can include your child's image on the website, Tapestry, Class Dojo, newsletter (which goes on the school website) and the local Guardian. Parents do need to be aware that the Warrington Guardian may use images taken on their social media pages. We are also very aware in this digital age that an image can be found on our website and copied and used, so want to ensure parents/ carers are fully informed when giving consent. If you have said no to social media we have removed all photograph permissions and you will be asked each time when permission is required. For example, our school photographer taking group photographs as these can be shared digitally. Many thanks for your support.

OPAL PLAY-FLAG SYSTEM (REMINDER)



Children need to wear trainers when using the trim trail.

We have reminded the children that digging needs to be in the allocated digging area or the sand pit. They are encouraged not to dig near paths or on the fields due to trip hazards.

DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE ASTHMA?

Warrington Borough Council is working in collaboration with St Helens Borough Council and St Helens wellbeing teams on a DEFRA indoor air quality project called 'Healthy Air for Healthy Lungs'.

The project aims to improve the indoor air quality for households with children aged 2-10 who have asthma or persistent wheeze needing at least 3 salbutamol inhalers a year. Asthma is the most common long-term medical condition affecting children in the UK affecting around 1 in 11. We know that outcomes are worse for children and young people living in the most deprived areas.

The overall aim of the Healthy Air for Healthy Lungs project is to reduce unplanned and emergency admissions to hospital; reduce visits to the GP; reduce over reliance on reliver inhalers; improve overall asthma management using preventer therapy; and identify and support the wider causes of poor respiratory health.

Those who are eligible to participate in the project receive:

- An initial home air quality assessment
- Installation of an indoor air quality monitor which can measure particulate matter, volatile organic compounds, carbon dioxide, humidity, and temperature
- £50 Love to Shop Voucher or an air purifier if air quality is persistently poor
- Frequent personalised advice and support on how to improve their indoor air quality
- Regular check-ins with the St Helens wellbeing team
- Individualised support and signposting to services including housing, energy assistance, and wellbeing.

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
