Parent Forum

Many thanks to everyone who attended last week's Parent Forum. We found it a very informative session, and it has given us a lot of valuable insights to reflect on with senior leaders and governors.

This is a summary of the key themes:

What's Working Well:

- Parents appreciate the fortnightly newsletter, particularly the calendar and reminders sections.
- The School Spider app and Class Dojo are valued tools for staying informed and seeing class activities.
- Personal, approachable communication from teachers and office staff was consistently praised.
- Reception parents spoke positively about Tapestry, especially when it provides individualised updates.
- Efforts to engage working parents through evening communications and online alternatives to meetings were welcomed.
- Information on Expeditions and topic overviews has been well-received where shared.

Even Better If:

- There was a general consensus that parents would like more information about children's progress and attainment each term. This is achievable through our electronic data platform, where we can share attendance, attainment, and further guidance on supporting children at home.
- Parents would also like to receive information about weekly learning activities via Class Dojo.
- A more consistent communication system is preferred—one where parents can easily contact teachers. School raised that it is important for information is centrally accessible so that the office can support parents if teachers are unavailable.
- Having a central place for key information (e.g. an online calendar) would be helpful.
- A request to continue to consider working parents when arranging events and information evenings.

We've already looked into an online calendar on the school website and have made alternations to this newsletter to make information clearer. Over the summer, we will work on putting some firmer actions in place based on feedback and look forward to sharing those with all parents soon.

Abandoned Buildings


Warrington Police are urging parents and carers to make sure their children understand the dangers of playing in empty buildings after three teenagers were arrested on suspicion of burglary and criminal damage. The risks of abandoned buildings include questionable structural integrity, black mould and entry and exit hazards. It is also brings with it the risk of a criminal record.

Insp Lee Hillyard said: "We don't want to have to be knocking on parents or carers doors to deliver the upsetting and tragic news if someone is seriously injured, or worse, because unbeknown to them, the children were playing in an unsafe derelict building."

Anyone who sees children entering empty properties should contact Cheshire Police on 101, or 999 in an emergency.

Year 1 Football Tournament




